



Waste Service Providers

Last updated – 29 November 2011

This document provides information on the categories of waste that can be reused or recycled in the Nelson/Tasman area. Details of the service providers and how they can be contacted are provided at the end of the document.

Items that have the potential to be reused can be taken to one of the local re-use shops. However, it is suggested that you contact them first to see if they will take it. Households in Nelson can advertise items for reuse via the Freecycle website <http://groups.freecycle.org/FreecycleNelson>. Other options are to advertise for free in the Nelson Mail (under \$100 category); Sell, Buy, Swap; the GB Weekly.

This document is regularly updated however; the latest version is downloadable from the WES website, www.wes.org.nz. The date at the top of this document indicates when it was last updated. A range of additional resources can also be downloaded from both sites.

Agricultural Chemicals

- Agricultural chemicals are taken by Agrecovery. All collections need to be booked in advance. Details of costs are provided at the time of booking. Further information is available from www.agrecovery.co.nz. Agricultural chemicals should not be taken to the Resource Recovery Centres or transfer stations around the region.
- EnviroWaste provide a chemical waste collection service through ChemWaste.

Agricultural Chemical Containers

- Triple-rinsed HDPE plastic agricultural containers (40 litres or less) are taken at both the Richmond and Mariri Resource Recovery Centres for the Agrecovery scheme. Further information is available from www.agrecovery.co.nz.
- Plasback (a service run by Agpac) has a collection system for triple-rinsed HDPE plastic chemical containers (up to 60 litres). 100 and 200 litre drums from the Ecolab and FIL range (triple-rinsed) are recovered for FREE through the Plasback collection scheme. Further information is available from www.plasback.co.nz.

Agricultural/Farm Plastic & other non-chemical waste

- Agpac runs a service called Plasback. This facilitates the storage, collection and recycling of agricultural/farm plastics directly from the farm premises. The system consists of a sturdy weatherproof bin, liners and collection. Pick-up is across the region, including Golden Bay and Richmond. The Plasback scheme also accepts woven polypropylene bags.
- AgRecovery also provide a collection service (\$67.50 for 5 wrap bags) for agricultural/farm plastics. A wheelie bin is also available for purchase if required. Further information is available at www.agrecovery.co.nz.
- AgRecovery have started a new service to collect agricultural netting for recycling. Further information is available at www.agrecovery.co.nz.

Aluminium & Steel Cans

- All Resource Recovery Centres in the region accept aluminium and steel cans - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood.
- Can Plan, EnviroWaste, Nelmac and Waste Management provide commercial collection services.
- Helping Hands can provide a collection service in Golden Bay.
- Scrap metal dealers will buy quantities of cans and will often pick them up for free – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under the ‘Scrap Metal Dealers’ section.

Appliances

- All Resource Recovery Centres in the region accept appliances - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood.
- Second hand dealers may buy or take old appliances if they still work – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under the ‘Secondhand Dealers’ section.
- Some manufacturers of appliances allow old items to be returned to local service centres that deal with their products e.g. Fisher & Paykel and Black & Decker (will also accept old rechargeable batteries). Check the guarantee/instruction leaflet that came with the appliance.
- Motueka Appliance Service & Repair will take old whiteware and may be willing to pick up items. They service/refurbish/use serviceable parts and sell the second-hand units.

Batteries

- Automotive and other lead-acid batteries are accepted free of charge at some Resource Recovery Centres. This is done at the operator's discretion. They are also accepted at many scrap metal dealers.
- Householders can take batteries containing heavy metals (lead, nickel-cadmium, nickel-metal hydride, lithium and mercury) to the Nelson City Council Transfer Station for free. This includes laptop batteries.
- For mobile phone batteries – see 'Mobile Phones' section.
- Black & Decker take old rechargeable batteries from their appliances and dispose of them responsibly.
- Interwaste provides a nationwide battery recycling collection scheme for batteries containing nickel, cadmium, mercury or lithium.
- Recell repack old rechargeable battery packs i.e. from power tools. They reuse the plastic casing, recycle the old battery components and repack new components for less than it costs for a new unit. They do not repack laptop batteries.

Bicycles

- Bicycles are accepted at the Nelson Recycling Centre and the Richmond Revive Shop.
- Karen & Daryl Brandford (Victory, Nelson) accept old bikes. They do them up and sell them on very cheaply so are always looking for old bikes and bits.
- Peter Wells may take them, do them up and sell them on.

Cardboard

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept cardboard -: Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood for households.
- EnviroWaste provide a service to collect bundled cardboard, wheelie bins or cages in Nelson, Stoke and Richmond.
- Nelmac provides a service to collect bundled cardboard in Nelson.
- Waste Management provides cardboard cages.
- Can Plan collects bundled cardboard and paper, wheelie bins & cardboard cages in Nelson, Tahunanui & Stoke and plan to expand to other areas in the near future.
- Full Circle provide cages and wheelie bins throughout the Nelson and Tasman region.
- Helping Hands provide a collection service in Golden Bay.

Clothes

- Good quality clothing for reuse can be taken to the Nelson Recycling Centre and the Richmond Revive Shop.
- There are many second-hand clothes shops that accept good quality second hand clothes. Check the 'Yellow Pages' under 'Clothing – Second-hand'.
- Town & Country Recycling may pick up items that can be reused.

Construction & Demolition

- Reusable timber lengths (treated or non-treated) are accepted free of charge at all Resource Recovery Centres at the operator's discretion.
- Reusable plasterboard is accepted free of charge at the Nelson Recycle Centre at the operator's discretion.
- Green Waste to Zero will accept the following items for a fee (cheaper than landfill):
 - Plasterboard – unpainted. It will be crushed, screened and sold as fertiliser
 - Greenwaste
 - Hardfill
 - Concrete
 - Topsoil
- Wholesale Landscapes will accept the following items for a fee (please call them before dumping the material):
 - Untreated wood waste (including boxing timber; ply; MDF; painted wood; shavings & sawdust) for re-use as a fuel – at their Brightwater depot
 - Greenwaste – at their Brightwater and Stoke depots
 - Hardfill – at their Stoke depot
 - Concrete – at their Stoke depot
 - Topsoil – at their Brightwater & Stoke depots
- EnviroWaste & Waste Management will both provide separate skips or bins for cardboard/paper; green waste; and untreated wood waste at some construction sites depending on the location and access.
- EnviroWaste & Fullcircle provide a collection service for clear soft plastics (i.e. framewrap).
- Can Plan provides recycling collection services for cardboard, hardcore and green/organic waste collections.
- House parts and timbers that can be reused are taken by some of the demolition or second hand dealers – see 'Yellow Pages' under 'Demolition' or 'Second-hand Dealers'.
- Town & Country Recycling may pick up items that can be reused.

- MultiDig has a machine that crushes wood waste etc (removing nails) to compact it, which can be driven onto your site. This significantly reduces volume so decreasing the number of skips required and space taken in landfill. This also enables untreated wood waste/green waste to be reused for mulch etc.
- Helping Hands may be able to provide a collection service in Golden Bay.
- Check out www.rebri.org.nz for advice on reducing waste on construction and demolition sites, and contact WES to find out what initiatives are available locally.

Dental Amalgam

- Morris and Watson Ltd and Interwaste provide services for the collection and recycling of dental amalgam, extracting the silver.

Electronics (TVs, computers, videos, game machines etc.)

- Computers etc that are still working but slowly can be upgraded. There are many computer hardware companies that can provide this service – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under “Computer Hardware” for more details.
- An electronic waste (eWaste) recycling service (e-Cycle) is now available from the Nelson Recycle Centre everyday for all electronic waste. There is a cost involved in dropping off material to cover the cost of freight, handling and processing. All eWaste taken through the scheme will be recycled or reused – nothing will go to landfill. More details available at www.e-cycle.co.nz
- The Motueka Recreation Centre may take your old computer equipment to refurbish it for use within the community and also encourage kids to learn how to rebuild computers.
- Brother printers will be recycled if they are dropped off at Nelspecs.
- Laptop batteries are accepted at the Nelson Transfer Station for free recycling.

Food waste

- Composting at home - discount vouchers for compost, EM Bokashi and worm bins are available from Nelson City and Tasman District Councils. Details of where the bins and worms can be purchased are identified in the leaflet. Otherwise a compost heap can be created or bins can be made at home. More information on how to handle this waste at home can be found at www.wes.org.nz
- Can Plan provide an organic skip collection which can be combined/mixed with a green waste collection.
- Bokashi NZ provide custom built 240 litre wheelie bins to allow commercial scale bokashi systems to be set up. These systems are ideal for cafes and restaurants. Smaller household-

sized bokashi systems (suitable for food waste from an office or smoko room) can be purchased through Bokashi Boost and a number of other retailers.

- Contact the WES Team directly for other options for organic/food waste.

Furniture

- Re-usable items can be taken to the Richmond Revive Shop or the Nelson Recycling Centre.
- Furniture that can be reused may also be taken by some second-hand dealers – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under ‘Second-hand Dealers’.
- Town & Country Recycling may pick up items that can be reused – they give them away to organisations like Family Start.

Glass (Bottles/Jars)

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept household glass - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood. Tasman centres now expect it to be colour sorted
- Can Plan offer a 2m³ skip collection service. BinGo skip hire run a commercial glass recycling service in Tasman. EnviroWaste also provides a glass recycling service throughout the region.
- Helping Hands can provide a collection service in Golden Bay.

Green waste

- Compost at home using a compost or worm bin – discount vouchers are available from Nelson City and Tasman District Councils to purchase a compost bin, worm farm or bokashi system. Details of where the bins and worms can be purchased are detailed on the discount voucher.
- Alternatively you can take your greenwaste to the following places (it's cheaper per volume to take your greenwaste to these sites than it is to dispose of general rubbish at the Resource Recovery Centres),
 - Green Waste to Zero, Richmond
 - Millers Landscape Supplies, Tahuna
 - Nelson City Council Transfer Station
 - Resource Recovery Centres at Mariri; Takaka; Collingwood
 - Wholesale Landscapes, Stoke & Brightwater – phone firstCharges apply to all centres. Flax leaves, toitoi, bamboo and palm leaves are ONLY accepted at Wholesale Landscapes.
- Nelmac provides a green waste collection service for households and businesses.
- Can Plan, EnviroWaste and Waste Management provide a collection service for businesses.

- BinGo Skip Hire, Motueka Bin Hire and Scotts HIR-A-BIN Motueka provide bins and mini skips, which if filled with greenwaste only will dispose of them in the green waste disposal areas of the Resource Recovery Centres – saving you money.

Hazardous Waste

Do not put hazardous waste (e.g. paint, batteries, oil) into general household or business waste bins or bags as this can cause significant danger to waste collection staff. It is also extremely hazardous to the environment. Once in landfill, it can leak through soils and contaminate groundwater, affecting the food chain.

- Householders in Tasman District should check the 'Household Hazardous Waste' leaflet available from TDC or their website.
- Householders in Nelson should contact the Nelson City Council Transfer station.
- Commercial operations or waste that is not accepted at the transfer station can be handled by JBL Environmental Ltd., ERS, EnviroWaste and Sepclean.

Light Bulbs

- Incandescent lamps (standard light bulbs) should be wrapped in newspaper and disposed of in the general rubbish.
- Energy saving and other mercury containing lamps (including fluorescent tubes) should be recycled or treated as hazardous waste due to the mercury contained within them.
- Collection boxes are now located at Mitre 10 Mega; Bunnings Warehouse, Stoke; Nelson transfer station and the Nelson City Council civic house reception area.
- Interwaste provide a collection bin and pick-up service for commercial operations at a cost. All parts of the lamps are recycled.

Liquids including Oils (Oils and Waxes)

- Waste oil (up to 4 litres and not from commercial operations) is accepted free of charge at Resource Recovery Centres at the operator's discretion.
- For commercial operations larger quantities and pick-ups (including chemicals) are available with ERS, EnviroWaste and Sepclean.

LPG bottles

- If LPG bottles can no longer be refilled they are accepted free of charge at the Resource Recovery Centre on Beach Road, Richmond.

Machinery/Tools

- Reusable items can be taken to the Richmond Revive Shop or the Nelson Recycling Centre.
- All Resource Recovery Centres accept machinery and tools at the operator's discretion - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood.

Metal

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept metal at the operator's discretion - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood.
- Scrap metal dealers will often collect large and/or regular quantities for free.
- Helping Hands can provide a collection service in Golden Bay.

Mobile Phones

- Individual phones, batteries and chargers can be taken to any Vodafone, Telecom or Telecom Dealer (Leading Edge and Orb) store. All models of mobiles are accepted at each outlet.
- If you have a lot of phones that you would like to recycle, you can download a Freepost label from the Vodafone website <http://www.vodafone.co.nz/about/corporate-responsibility/mobile-recycling.jsp>.
- Noel Leeming has collection boxes in-store for old mobiles and may also offer a trade-in against old Vodafone mobiles for some new mobiles.
- An electronic waste (eWaste) recycling service (e-Cycle) is now available from the Nelson Recycle Centre everyday which accepts mobile phones as well as all other types of electronics. Mobile phones are free to drop off. All eWaste taken through the scheme will be recycled or reused – nothing will go to landfill. More details available at www.e-cycle.co.nz

Oil Drums

- All Tasman Resource Recovery Centres will accept oil drums at the operator's discretion - Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood – at the operator's discretion.
- Bens Oil (EnviroWaste) will collect oil drums and clean them up. If the metal can be recycled/re-used there will be no charge, if it can't (i.e. they are old and rusty) the charge is \$5 per drum because they will have to crush it and dispose of it. They also collect oil filters.
- ERS will collect old oil drums and waste oil.

Paints & Containers

- Resene ColorShop will take old paint and containers from households and businesses. There is a small charge for non-Resene branded paint. The Richmond Resource Recovery Centre also accepts paint under the same terms.
- Households only can dispose of it at the Nelson City Council Transfer station for free – see Hazardous waste section.
- Note Tasman District residents will need to get agreement prior to depositing the paint here, this is detailed in the Hazardous Waste section of this leaflet.

Pallets

- All Resource Recovery Centres will accept wooden pallets - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; Collingwood.
- Wholesale Landscapes will take untreated wooden pallets for a fee at their Brightwater depot (please ring first). The pallets are crushed; metal removed and the wood used as fuel within an industrial environment reducing the need to burn coal or oil.
- Pallets made from treated timber should not be burnt as they will give off toxic fumes and the ash will also be toxic.

Paper

- All Resource Recovery Centres will accept waste paper - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood.
- Commercial collections of paper for recycling are provided by Can Plan, EnviroWaste, Fullcircle, Nelmac and Waste Management. The services offered depend on the quantities involved and the location of the business.
- Iron Mountain and Lighthouse Commercial Services provide a local service for collection of confidential documents and office paper. This is shredded in the truck and sent for recycling. A similar service is provided to other companies in this area through SBS Security in Blenheim. Other document disposal options are also available – see ‘Yellow Pages’ section on ‘Document Destruction’ and ‘Records Management’.
- Helping Hands can provide a collection service in Golden Bay.

Photographic, X-ray Film & Fixer

- Morris & Watson Ltd and Interwaste provide services to recycle x-ray and photographic film, and the fixer fluids.

Plastics (Types 1-7)

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept plastics 1-7 - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood.
- Can Plan provide a wheelie bin (240 and 1100litre) service for mixed plastic, cans and tins.
- EnviroWaste (Nelson/Richmond), Nelmac (Nelson/Stoke) and Waste Management provide commercial collections for plastics.
- Helping Hands can provide a collection service in Golden Bay.

Plastic Bags (e.g. supermarket bags)

- Use reusable bags/boxes whenever possible and reuse plastic bags as many times as you can.
- If reuse is no longer possible, find an outlet to recycle them. Nelson Recycling Centre has a bin for plastic bags and The Warehouse, Countdown, Woolworths and Fresh Choice provide a facility to deposit plastic bags. Check other shops for similar services.
- Nelmac recycle them through their household kerbside & commercial recycling collections in Nelson/Stoke.

Plastics – Soft (i.e. shrink/bale wrap/bubble wrap)

- EnviroWaste provide a service for soft plastics – contact them directly for details.
- Fullcircle provide a service to collect clear soft plastic.
- See the section on Agricultural/Farm Plastics above for details of services available to this sector.

Polystyrene

Many shops that deliver goods to your home or business will remove the polystyrene and reuse it. If they do not offer to do this, it is always worth asking.

Printers

- See the 'Computer' section for details of general reuse and recycling options for electronic waste including printers.
- Brother printers will be recycled if they are dropped off at Nelspecs.

Printer/Photocopier Cartridges

- Cartridge World refill old inkjet and laser printer cartridges and they will also buy some cartridges for refilling. Those that they are unable to refill are broken up and the plastic casing is recycled.
- Refill old inkjet and laser cartridges at various local commercial outlets – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under the ‘Computer Supplies’ section for options.
- Inkjet and toner cartridges can be posted to the TRC (Toner Recycling Centre) for recycling. They will send you a box which you can return once full. The fee is \$10, which covers the cost of sending and collecting the box.
- Xerox cartridges may be recycled by Fuji-Xerox. Check out their website for information and for the cartridges that they recycle.

Rubber, Leather & Carpet

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept rubber, leather and carpet - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood.

Sewage

- Composting toilets are available through The Mussel Inn, Golden Bay.
- A waste treatment system called Biolytix is available through Days (plumbing company). This recycles sewage, greywater, sanitary items and food scraps into compost for the garden.
- Kiwi Bog produces a compact composting toilet.

Tyres

- All Resource Recovery Centres and the Nelson City Council Transfer Station accept tyres. All disposals incur a charge.

Wood

- All Resource Recovery Centres accept wood - Nelson; Richmond; Mariri; Murchison; Takaka; and Collingwood.
- Wholesale Landscapes take all untreated wood waste at their Brightwater depot (sawmill waste, clean construction & demolition waste, joinery factory off-cuts, sawdust and shavings, pallets and gluts etc.). They process it into fuel. Please phone them before taking the material.

- EnviroWaste & Waste Management offer skips/bins and a pick-up service to some sites depending on their location and accessibility. This is at their discretion. Additional charges are made if the bin is contaminated with other types of waste.
- MultiDig has a machine to crush wood waste etc (removing nails) that can be driven onto your site. This reduced the volume resulting in fewer skips being required. Untreated wood waste/green waste is reused for mulch and therefore reduces landfill costs. MultiDig can also crush treated timber (including boron treated) reducing its volume. However, this still has to go to landfill.
- Timbers that can be reused may be taken by some demolition or second-hand dealers – see ‘Yellow Pages’ under ‘Demolition’ or ‘Second-hand Dealers’.

Workshop Waste

- ERS collect and dispose of the following types of workshop waste in an environmentally sound way:
 - Oil filters
 - Oily rags
 - Coolant
 - Brake fluid
 - Waste water
 - Empty drums
 - Absorbent waste
 - Parts cleaning solvents waste
 - Waste oil (drums or bulk)

X-ray, Photographic Film & Fixer

- Morris & Watson Ltd and Interwaste provide services to recycle x-ray and photographic film, and the fixer fluids.
